




Preschool teachers are a primary resource in promoting literacy in their classrooms. Each day they have opportunities to engage children in meaningful language and literacy experiences.

Pre-K ELLA is designed to:

- ★ Advance teacher understanding of how three to five year old children develop language and literary skills and why it is important that children develop these skills.
- ★ Present tools and techniques teachers can use in their classrooms to help children develop language and literacy skills they will need to become proficient readers and writers.
- ★ Transfer Pre-K ELLA teacher training into children's everyday classroom experiences and activities.
- ★ Assist teachers in developing strategies for involving families and their children in language and literacy experiences at home.
- ★ Make language and literacy experiences enjoyable for teachers, children and their families.

What does the training offer teachers?
