

Katy No-Pocket

1. Run copies on cardstock (index paper or tagboard).
2. Color pieces with markers, color pencils (may not be as bright), pastels, or paint, (crayons may melt when laminated).
3. When putting two large pieces together, use a glue stick to prevent pieces from wrinkling when laminating.
4. Laminate story objects. You may cut pieces before or after laminating.
5. Attach velcro dots or pieces to back of each object.


Tip: Make an outline story card to use when telling the story.


Remember patterns are not to be used for children's art projects!



Patterns may be use for teacher made puppets which children can use for story retelling. Patterns may be enlarged if preferred.


Suggested Activities:

1. Examine tools: Match tools to an outline drawn on poster board. (*Use real tools only with supervision, plastic tools for independent use.) (3.10)
2. Add carpenter apron to dramatic play (with tools*) (2.1)
3. Add baby animals to carpenter apron for story retelling. (2.1, 3.2)
4. Fold a sheet of construction paper (8 1/2 X 11) in half. Tape the sides, leaving the top open for a "pocket". On the outside write, _____ said, "I would carry _____ in my pocket". Complete with child's response. Allow children to illustrate their sentence and place illustration in pocket. (2/11, 3.5, 5.5)














