SECTION 1 - GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

1.1 PURPOSE

The State of Arkansas, Department of Human Services (DHS), Division of Medical Services (DMS) issues this Invitation for Bid, thereafter referred to as the IFB, to qualified vendors to provide services for statewide administration of the Arkansas Beneficiary Relations and Non-Emergency Transportation (NET) Administration.

Arkansas Medicaid strives to continuously improve the quality and effectiveness of the medical care received by its beneficiaries. In order to do that, Arkansas Medicaid seeks to establish and maintain positive relationships with Medicaid beneficiaries, assist beneficiaries in Medicaid related matters, and assess beneficiary satisfaction and health status.

In addition, Arkansas Medicaid provides NET services to Medicaid beneficiaries in covered aid categories according to program guidelines. Arkansas Medicaid seeks a qualified organization to manage and monitor the provision of those services.

The purpose of this IFB is to solicit bids from qualified vendors to:

- A. Maintain positive relations with Medicaid beneficiaries by:
 - Establishing a beneficiary complaint line and complaint resolution process;
 - Delivering and developing beneficiary directed correspondence and information; and
 - Conducting beneficiary surveys; and
- B. Manage the NET programs by:
 1. Establishing a transportation help line;
 2. Monitoring transportation brokers;
 3. Reviewing the transportation programs policies, and
 4. Responding to beneficiary and provider complaints regarding transportation issues.

1.2 TYPE OF CONTRACT

- A. A Term contract will be awarded to a single vendor.
- B. Any resultant contract of this *Bid Solicitation* **shall** be subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review.
- C. The term of this contract **shall** be for one (1) year. The anticipated starting date for the contract is 07/01/2017. Upon mutual agreement by the vendor and agency, the contract may be renewed by OP on a year-to-year basis, for up to six (6) additional one-year terms or a portion thereof.
- D. The total contract term **shall not** be more than seven (7) years.

1.3 ISSUING AGENCY

The Office of Procurement (OP), as the issuing office, is the sole point of contact throughout this solicitation process. Vendor questions regarding this Bid Solicitation should be made through the State's buyer as shown on page two of this document. Vendor's questions will be answered as a courtesy and at vendor's own risk.

1.4 BID OPENING LOCATION

Bids submitted by the opening time and date **shall** be opened at the following location:

Vendors wishing to attend the bid opening must report to the main entrance location, Arkansas Department of Human Services, Donaghey Plaza South Building, 700 Main Street, Little Rock, Arkansas 72201 and check in with the receptionist. All attendees are required to obtain security clearance upon entrance to the building by submitting a current, valid photo ID, preferably a driver's license, to the Security Officer at the reception area. The Security Officer will issue a visitor's badge which must be worn at all times. Before leaving the bid opening visitors are required to return the visitor's badge to the Security Officer and retrieve their ID.

The receptionist is to contact the buyer, for the vendor, for more detailed directions to the bid opening location.

1.5 DEFINITION OF REQUIREMENT

- A. The words "**must**" and "**shall**" signify a Requirement of this solicitation and that vendor's agreement to and compliance with that item is mandatory.
- B. Exceptions taken to any Requirement in this *Bid Solicitation*, whether submitted in the vendor's bid or in subsequent correspondence, **shall** cause the vendor's bid to be disqualified.
- C. Vendor may request exceptions to NON-mandatory items. Any such request **must** be declared on, or as an attachment to, the appropriate section's *Agreement and Compliance Page*. Vendor **must** clearly explain the requested exception and should reference the specific solicitation item number to which the exception applies. (See *Agreement and Compliance Page*.)

1.6 DEFINITION OF TERMS

- A. The State Procurement Official has made every effort to use industry-accepted terminology in this *Bid Solicitation* and will attempt to further clarify any point of an item in question as indicated in *Clarification of Bid Solicitation*.
- B. The words "bidder" and "vendor" are used synonymously in this document.
- C. The terms "Invitation for Bid", "IFB" and "Bid Solicitation" are used synonymously in this document.

1.7 RESPONSE DOCUMENTS

A. *Bid Response Packet*

- An official authorized to bind the vendor(s) to a resultant contract **must** sign the *Bid Signature Page*.
- Vendor's signature on this page **shall** signify vendor's agreement that either of the following **shall** cause the vendor's bid to be disqualified
 - a. Additional terms or conditions submitted intentionally or inadvertently.
 - b. Any exception that conflicts with a Requirement of this *Bid Solicitation*.
- The following items **shall** be submitted with the *Bid Response Packet in a sealed envelope*.
 - a. Copy of Vendor's *Equal Opportunity Policy*. (See *Equal Opportunity Policy*.)
 - b. Signed addenda to this IFB, if applicable. (See Requirement of Addendum.)
 - c. Documentation that vendor meets the minimum qualifications outlined in this IFB. (See *Minimum Qualifications*.)
- **DO NOT** include any other documents or ancillary information, such as a cover letter or promotional/marketing information. **Submit one (1) electronic copy of the response packet, excluding the Official Bid Price Sheet, on a flash drive. To the extent possible, all electronic files should be a single file PDF format.**

B. Official Bid Price Sheet. (See Pricing.)

- Vendor's original *Official Bid Price Sheet* **must** be submitted in hard copy format.
- Vendor should also submit one (1) electronic copy of the *Official Bid Price Sheet*, on a flash drive, in a single file PDF format.
- The *Official Bid Price Sheet*, including the hard copy and electronic copy, must be separately sealed from the *Bid Response Packet* and should be clearly marked as "Pricing". Vendor must not include any pricing in the hard copies or electronic copies of the *Bid Response Packet*.

1.8 AGREEMENT AND COMPLIANCE PAGES

- A. Vendor **must** sign all *Agreement and Compliance Pages* relevant to each section of the *Bid Solicitation Document*. The *Agreement and Compliance Pages* are included in the *Bid Response Packet*.
- B. Vendor's signature on these pages **shall** signify agreement to and compliance with all requirements within the designated section.

1.9 SUBCONTRACTORS

- A. Vendor **must** complete, sign and submit the *Proposed Subcontractors Form* included in the *Bid Response Packet* to indicate vendor's intent to utilize, or to not utilize, subcontractors.
- B. Additional subcontractor information may be required or requested in following sections of this *Bid Solicitation*. **Do not** attach any additional information to the *Proposed Subcontractors Form*.

1.10 PRICING

- A. Vendor(s) **must** include all pricing on the *Official Bid Price Sheet(s)* only. Any cost not identified by the successful vendor but subsequently incurred in order to achieve successful operation **shall** be borne by the vendor.
- B. A justification of prices quoted should be attached to the *Official Bid Price Sheet*.
- C. To allow time to evaluate bids, prices **must** be valid for 120 days following the bid opening.
- D. Failure to complete and submit the *Official Bid Price Sheet* **shall** result in disqualification.
- E. All bid pricing **must** be in United States dollars and cents.
- F. The *Official Bid Price Sheet* may be reproduced as needed.
- G. The *Official Bid Price Sheet* and accompanying price justification **must** be separately sealed from the *Bid Response Packet*.

1.11 PRIME CONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY

- A. A joint bid submitted by two (2) or more vendors is acceptable. However, a single vendor **must** be identified as the prime contractor.
- B. The prime contractor **shall** be held responsible for the contract and **shall** be the sole point of contact.

1.12 INDEPENDENT PRICE DETERMINATION

- A. By submission of this bid, the vendor certifies, and in the case of a joint response, each party thereto certifies as to its own organization, that in connection with this bid:
- The prices in the bid have been arrived at independently, without collusion.
 - No prior information concerning these prices has been received from, or given to, a competitive company.
- B. Evidence of collusion **shall** warrant consideration of this bid by the Office of the Attorney General. All vendors **shall** understand that this paragraph may be used as a basis for litigation.

1.13 PROPRIETARY INFORMATION

- A. Response documents pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* become the property of the State and are subject to the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- B. One (1) complete copy of the submission documents from which any proprietary information has been redacted should be submitted on a flash drive. A CD is also acceptable.
- C. Except for the redacted information, the redacted copy **must** be identical to the original hard copy, reflecting the same pagination as the original and showing the space from which information was redacted.
- D. The vendor **shall** be responsible for identifying all proprietary information and for ensuring the electronic copy is protected against restoration of redacted data.
- E. The redacted copy **shall** be open to public inspection under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) without further notice to the vendor.
- F. If a redacted copy of the submission documents is not provided with vendor's response packet, a copy of the non-redacted documents, with the exception of financial data (other than pricing), **shall** be released in response to any request made under the Arkansas Freedom of Information Act (FOIA).
- G. If the State deems redacted information to be subject to FOIA, the vendor will be contacted prior to release of the documents.

1.14 CAUTION TO VENDORS

- A. Prior to any contract award, all communication concerning this *Bid Solicitation* **must** be addressed through OP.
- B. Vendor **must not** alter any language in any solicitation document provided by the State.
- C. Vendor **must not** alter the Official Bid Price Sheet.
- D. All official documents and correspondence related to this solicitation **shall** be included as part of the resultant contract.
- E. Bids **must** be submitted only in the English language.
- F. The State **shall** have the right to award or not award a contract, if it is in the best interest of the State to do so.
- G. Vendor **must** provide clarification of any information in their response documents as requested by OP.
- H. Bids **must** meet or exceed all defined specifications as set forth in this *Bid Solicitation*.
- I. Bids **must** meet all terms and conditions of this Invitation for Bid and the laws of the State of Arkansas.
- J. Vendors may submit multiple bids.

1.15 REQUIREMENT OF ADDENDUM

- A. This *Bid Solicitation* **shall** be modified only by an addendum written and authorized by OP.
- B. An addendum posted within three (3) calendar days prior to the bid opening **shall** extend the bid opening and may or may not include changes to the Bid Solicitation.

1.16 AWARD PROCESS

A. Vendor Selection

1. Award **shall** be made on an ALL OR NONE basis to the lowest responsive bidder. Bidders must meet minimum qualifications. Bids must meet or exceed all defined specifications. Bids must meet all terms and conditions of this Invitation for Bid and the laws of the State of Arkansas.

Contract award, extension, or renewal is contingent upon approval by officials of DHS, subsequent approval by the DHS Office of Procurement, review by the Legislative Council and the availability of State funds. Changes to any non-financial portion of this agreement may be made with the agreement of both DHS and the Contractor.

B. Anticipation to Award

1. Once an anticipated successful vendor has been determined, the anticipated award will be posted on the following websites:

2. The anticipated award will be posted for a period of fourteen (14) days prior to the issuance of a contract. Vendors and agencies are cautioned that these are preliminary results only, and a contract will not be issued prior to the end of the fourteen day posting period.
3. OP **shall** have the right to waive the policy of Anticipation to Award when it is in the best interest of the State.
4. It is the vendor's responsibility to check the above referenced websites for the posting of an anticipated award.

C. Issuance of Contract

1. Any resultant contract of this Bid Solicitation shall be subject to State approval processes which may include Legislative review.
2. An Office of Procurement Official will be responsible for award and administration of any resulting contract.

1.17 MINORITY BUSINESS POLICY

A. Minority is defined by Arkansas Code Annotated § 15-4-303 as a lawful permanent resident of this State who is:

- African American
- American Indian
- Asian American
- Hispanic American
- Pacific Islander American
- A Service Disabled Veterans as designated by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs

B. The Arkansas Economic Development Commission conducts a certification process for minority businesses and disabled veterans. The vendor's Certification Number should be included on the vendor's *Bid Signature Page*.

1.18 EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY POLICY

A. In compliance with Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-104, OP is required to have a copy of the vendor's *Equal Opportunity (EO) Policy* included with the solicitation response.

B. *EO Policies* may be submitted in electronic format to the following email address: eeopolicy.osp@dfa.arkansas.gov, but **shall** also be included as a hardcopy accompanying the solicitation response.

C. The submission of an *EO Policy* to OSP is a one-time Requirement. Vendors are responsible for providing updates or changes to their respective policies, and for supplying *EO Policies* upon request to other State agencies that must also comply with this statute.

D. Vendors, who are not required by law by to have an *EO Policy*, **must** submit a written statement to that effect.

1.19 PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT OF ILLEGAL IMMIGRANTS

A. Pursuant to Arkansas Code Annotated § 19-11-105, prior to the award of a contract, selected vendor(s) **must** have a current certification on file with the Office of State Procurement (OSP) stating that they do not employ or contract with illegal immigrants.

B. OP will notify the selected vendor(s) prior to award if their certification has expired or is not on file. Instructions for completing the certification process will be provided to the vendor(s) at that time.

1.20 PAST PERFORMANCE

In accordance with provisions of State Procurement Law, specifically OSP Rule R5:19-11-230(b)(1), a vendor's past performance with the State may be used to determine if the vendor is "responsible". Proposals submitted by vendors determined to be non-responsible **shall** be disqualified.

1.21 COMPLIANCE WITH THE STATE SHARED TECHNICAL ARCHITECTURE PROGRAM

The respondent's solution must comply with the state's shared Technical Architecture Program which is a set of policies and standards that can be viewed at: <http://www.dis.arkansas.gov/policiesStandards/Pages/default.aspx>. Only those standards which are fully promulgated or have been approved by the Governor's Office apply to this solution.

1.22 VISA ACCEPTANCE

A. Awarded vendor should have the capability of accepting the State's authorized VISA Procurement Card (p-card) as a method of payment.

B. Price changes or additional fee(s) **shall not** be levied against the State when accepting the p-card as a form of payment.

C. VISA is not the exclusive method of payment.

1.23 PUBLICITY

A. Vendors **shall not** issue a news release pertaining to this *Bid Solicitation* or any portion of the project without OP's prior written approval.

B. Failure to comply with this Requirement **shall** be cause for a vendor's bid to be disqualified.

1.24 RESERVATION

The State **shall not** pay costs incurred in the preparation of a bid.

1.25 Bidder's Questions

It is DHS intent that this IFB have adequate information for any/all vendors to respond. However, should a potential bidder have questions, they **shall** complete attachment G and send to Buyer shown on page 1, per the instruction below. The question and answer period is as follows:

Additional days can be proclaimed as holidays by the Governor through executive proclamation. State offices are normally closed on holidays; however there are occasions (i.e. during legislative sessions) when it may become necessary to keep state offices open on holidays. The Contractor shall maintain adequate staff on such working holidays.

SECTION 2 – MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

2.1 INTRODUCTION

This Invitation for Bid (IFB) is issued by the Office of Procurement (OP) for the Department of Human Services (DHS) Division of Medical Services (DMS) to obtain pricing and a contract for Medicaid Beneficiary Relations and Non-Emergency Transportation (NET) Administration. Included in this solicitation are requirements concerning outreach in ConnectCare services such as Primary Care Physician (PCP) assignment changes and overall quality assurance of program effectiveness

2.2 SERVICE DELIVERY LOCATION

All services must be provided during normal state work hours and within the agreed upon number of days unless otherwise arranged and coordinated with the agency. The vendor shall give the agency immediate notice of any anticipated delays that will affect the service delivery requirement.

2.3 MINIMUM QUALIFICATION

The Contractor **must** meet the following requirements:

- A Vendor **shall** have at least 5 years' prior experience in similar agencies that fall under the Federal Department of Health and Human Services. Vendor **shall** provide evidence of this experience in the *Bid Response Packet*.
- B. Bidders must include a Dun & Bradstreet SQR report with a minimum score of 4, report to be dated within 1 year of bid submittal. (see attachment H)

2.4 SCOPE OF WORK

The contractor **shall** establish and maintain effective and efficient customer service for individuals eligible for services through Arkansas Medicaid or premium assistance. The contractor **shall** provide accurate and up to date information about health care coverage, effectively assist in resolving issues or concerns, ensure enrollment in a qualified health plan, and provide contact information for health plans or providers. The contractor **shall** conduct effective monthly county-based educational meetings for newly eligible individuals for services through Arkansas Medicaid. The contractor **shall** design, develop, implement and manage this process for meeting the effectiveness of the County meetings. Newly eligible beneficiaries average approximately 9000 members per month. The awareness strategy should cover, without limitation, Primary Care Physician (PCP) selection, Primary Care Case Management (PCCM), and Access Arkansas portal. The contractor **shall** operate and maintain a toll-free call line which is available to callers from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday - Friday following the state work schedule. The contractor shall document complaints and issues received from, without limitation Medicaid and ARKids First beneficiaries, guardians, and dental providers.

The contractor must meet Quality Assurance Reform Initiative (QARI) guidelines for the monitoring and maintenance of beneficiary satisfaction through the beneficiary grievance procedure. The contractor shall ensure that promotional and informational materials are available in Spanish. The contractor shall:

- 1) Complete surveys in the timeframes as specified in the performance indicators.
- 2) Obtain DMS approval of surveys prior to dissemination
- 3) Ensure that surveys are available in Spanish
- 4) Develop and deliver promotional and informational materials regarding DMS programs for Medicaid beneficiaries, including but not limited to the Medicaid Beneficiary Handbook.
- 5) Ensure that all written information provided to beneficiaries or potential beneficiaries is accurate, is not misleading, is comprehensible to its intended audience, designed to provide the greatest degree of understanding, and is written at the sixth grade reading level.

Additionally, the contractor conduct health care related surveys acceptable to DMS, including without limitation: health status surveys and beneficiary satisfaction surveys for, NET, Prenatal Services, ARKids B, ARKids A, and ARHealth Networks. The contractor **shall** also conduct focus group evaluations with the ARHealth Networks enrollees and, if requested, Medicaid beneficiaries. The contractor **shall**:

- A. Perform and analyze at least two (2) patient surveys annually to DMS satisfaction.
- B. Provide copies of each survey, results, and report cards if required, to DMS.

- C. Produce executive summaries and report cards if required, at the conclusion of the data analysis
- D. Ensure that all information is available on the website or in a manner acceptable to DMS.
- E. Provide an executive report to DMS within 30 days of completion of the focus groups.
- F. Provide reports regarding AKids B to the satisfaction of DMS requirements

The contractor **shall** conduct a survey regarding Mental Health which must be acceptable to the Division of Behavioral Health Services (DBHS). Beneficiary surveys **shall** be developed, performed and analyzed each contract year.

The contractor **must** manage and monitor NET and Ambulance Services provided to eligible Arkansas Medicaid beneficiaries. Contract(s) oversight shall include Driver qualifications. The contractor shall monitor compliance of Net contractors with the Arkansas Medicaid NET Manual, <https://www.medicaid.state.ar.us/consumer/net.aspx>. The contractor shall provide a transportation help-line which has a toll-free number, the capability to respond to the hearing impaired, the capability to respond to the Spanish speaking population, and is available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. following the State work schedule.

The contractor **must** regularly update and maintain communication with DMS regarding activities, beneficiary concerns, NET concerns, and potential additional beneficiary relations and NET projects at the request of DMS.

The contractor **shall** provide a fully functional Extension of Transportation Service (EOTS) helpline which has a toll free number, the capacity to respond to the hearing impaired, the capability to respond to the Spanish speaking population, and is available Monday-Friday 8:00 a.m. – 4:40 p.m., following the State work schedule.

At a minimum, the contractor **shall**:

Provide a toll-free beneficiary complaint line and a transportation help-line which must:

- have the capability to respond to the hearing impaired;
- have the capability to respond to the Spanish speaking population;
- be available Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Central Standard Time

The contractor shall:

- Process one hundred percent (100%) of complaints received pursuant to complaint resolution process; Upon request the complaint and its resolution **must** be provided to DHS/DMS or NET monitoring contractor within two (2) working days of the complaint.
- Send information about the complaint line to newly enrolled Medicaid beneficiaries;
- xMaintain a database of all complaints and their disposition;
- Maintain a computer database of all calls received on the transportation help-line and their disposition;
- Monitor transportation broker compliance with contract requirements;
- Visit 100% of the transportation brokers annually;
- Conduct additional on-site transportation brokers monitoring as needed;
- Review NET beneficiary records to ensure compliance;
- Research, track, and analyze NET trends;
- Review and recommend policies regarding the Medicaid transportation programs;
- Educate transportation providers regarding program policies and procedures;
- Act as a liaison between transportation brokers, vendors, and DMS;
- Respond to beneficiary, elected official, and public requests for information regarding the NET program, subject to the approval of DMS;
- Submit quarterly, annual, and ad hoc reports to DMS, in regards to NET;
- Establish a system of follow-up on missed appointments (NET) and arrange new appointments and transportation if needed; and
- Establish and maintain a log of complaints and issues from beneficiaries and dental providers, and their resolution if possible.

ConnectCare

The Contractor **must** provide a toll-free telephone helpline that will operate Monday through Friday 8:00 a.m. through 4:30 p.m. excluding State holidays. Fourteen (14) positions **must** assign or change PCPs per request of the beneficiary or guardian, and problem solve issues regarding locating a PCP and making an assignment. Caller information requests outside the scope of ConnectCare services will be referred to the appropriate DHS office or designated agency for appropriate follow-up and resolution. Spanish speaking callers **must** have access to a designated bilingual helpline specialist who will assign or change a PCP, problem solve issues in locating a PCP and making an assignment, and respond to Medicaid and ARKids First questions from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The contractor shall:

- a) Establish and maintain a log of issues and complaints received by ConnectCare from beneficiaries and medical providers and their resolution;
- b) Maintain Dental Coordinated Care services information on the ConnectCare website (www.seeyourdoc.org) in English and Spanish (with Google translate option);
- c) Dental care coordinators **must** verify the beneficiary's PCP and offer to transfer beneficiaries to ConnectCare helpline specialists for assistance with PCP assignment;
- d) Provide Medicaid resource information and answer beneficiary questions in accordance with guidelines provided by DMS. Caller information requests outside the scope of ConnectCare services and dental coordinated care will be referred to the appropriate DHS office or designated agency;
- e) ConnectCare **must** report documented complaints and issues to Medicaid Managed Care Services (MMCS) and to DMS;
- f) Dental Coordinated Care Program data **must** be collected in a web-based data system and reported to Medicaid. This information is used by the program for quality assurance and to measure program effectiveness;
- g) Ensure bilingual(English and Spanish) translation services are available for Hispanic callers requesting dental coordinated care services;
- h) Respond to questions received from Medicaid and ARKids First beneficiaries and dental providers by telephone concerning availability of dental services in their communities;
- i) Provide low-income, adult (age 21 and over) Arkansans without dental coverage, access to donated dental services; and
- j) Provide quarterly reports to DMS indicating, at a minimum, number of clients served.

2.5 **CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS**

Prior to the contract award and throughout the term of the contract the Vendor must provide DHS with an Arkansas State Police (ASP) certified Criminal Background Check for each employee or subcontractor. This includes any employees or subcontractors that may be added at a later date.

The background check releases a person's Arkansas felony and misdemeanor conviction record, any pending Arkansas felony arrests (where a person has been arrested and has not gone to trial) within the last three (3) years, and whether the person is a registered sex offender (levels one through four) or is required to register as a sex offender.

Online background reports will be accepted through the ASP website only.

1. The Vendor shall provide background checks to DHS at no cost to the State.
2. Background reports **must** be current. Current is defined as background reports which are dated and received by DHS within (72) hours of being sent by the ASP. Background reports which are not current shall not be considered.
3. Should ASP be delayed in sending the Criminal Background Reports to DHS, DHS will accept proof of payment and application from Vendor to receive the reports as compliant with this requirement.
4. DHS reserves the right to terminate any resultant contract resulting from this contract should evidence show tampering of any background reports.
5. The Vendor shall utilize the ASP for all background reports.
6. Vendor shall immediately notify DHS of any changes or substitutions of any employees or subcontractors assigned to a review.
7. Background Reports shall be sent by ASP directly to DHS for review.
8. All background checks **must** be provided to DHS for review and approval prior to an employee performing any work at any of the facilities. No employee shall be scheduled to commence work until and unless they

have passed a criminal background check.

9. DHS reserves the right to determine if a company employee passes or fails the criminal background check based on the results of the report. If the individual fails they shall not be allowed to provide services under any contract resulting from this IFB.
10. DHS shall have the right to require the Vendor to remove and replace an employee based on any findings in the background checks.
11. DHS reserves the right to require, at no cost to the State, additional background checks of any employee at any time during the initial or any subsequent terms of the contract should good cause exist. DHS shall have sole authority to determine good cause. Vendor shall complete the form and send it directly to the ASP after written notification from DHS has been provided

NOTE: Any employee with five (5) years residency in Arkansas is required to obtain the state's Criminal background check. Employees with less than five (5) years residency must obtain both state and federal criminal background checks.

2.6 INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Prior to contract award, the Vendor must furnish an approved "Certificate of Insurance" and must maintain the insurance requirements throughout the contract and any/all extensions.

The Insurance shall not be modified without DHS approval.

The Vendor shall maintain insurance for the contract period and any resultant renewals in the minimum amount:

- \$1,000,000 per occurrence,
- \$3,000,000 aggregate, for professional liability, negligence, errors and omissions and public liability.

The insurance must have limits sufficient to cover losses resulting from, or arising out of:

- Vendor's action or inaction in the performance of the contract by the Vendor, its agents, servants, employees, or subcontractors.

The insurance shall cover and continue to cover all occurrences during the term of this contract and any extensions thereof.

All insurance policies shall be with a company licensed by the State of Arkansas to do business and to provide such policies.

DHS is to be notified not less than 45 days in advance of any non-renewal, cancellation, or expiration of the Vendor's insurance policy. In the event DHS receives a notice of non-renewal, the Vendor shall provide DHS with an insurance policy from another carrier at least 30 days prior to the expiration of the insurance policy then in effect.

DHS shall have the right to inspect the original insurance policies held by the Vendor.

2.6 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

State law requires that all contracts for services include performance standards for measuring the overall quality of services provided. Performance standards identify expected deliverables, performance measures or outcomes and define the acceptable standards a vendor must meet in order to avoid assessment of damages.

The State may be open to negotiations of performance standards prior to contract award, prior to the commencement of services, or at times throughout the contract duration. See attachment D for all performance standards.

The State shall have the right to modify, add, or delete performance standards throughout the term of the contract, should the State determine it is in its best interest to do so. Any changes or additions to performance standards will be made in good faith following acceptable industry standards, and may include the input of the vendor so as to establish standards that are reasonably achievable.

All changes made to the performance standards shall become an official part of the contract.

Performance standards shall continue throughout the term of the contract.

Failure to meet the minimum performance standards as specified may result in the assessment of damages.

In the event a performance standard is not met, the vendor will have the opportunity to defend, respond to, or cure to the satisfaction of DMS the insufficiency. The State may waive damages if it determines there were extenuating factors beyond the control of the vendor that hindered the performance of services or it is in the best interest of the State. In these instances, the State shall have final determination of the performance acceptability.

These service areas are not the exclusive duties or requirements to be met under the contract, and nothing herein is indicated to comprehensively define, modify, or to limit the duties or liability of the Contractor for failure to perform in accordance with the terms of the contract, the scope of work above, or any other provision of this IFB. The IFB, including the scope of work, is binding on the contractor and shall be considered a part of the contract.

Should any compensation be owed to the agency due to the assessment of damages, the vendor shall follow the direction of the agency regarding the required compensation process.

The damages set forth do not in any way limit the damages available to the State, and **must** be in addition to any and all other damages or remedies available to the State at law or in equity.

2.6 PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

- A. State law requires that all contracts for services include Performance Standards for measuring the overall quality of services provided. *Attachment D: Performance Standards* identifies expected deliverables, performance measures, or outcomes; and defines the acceptable standards a vendor **must** meet in order to avoid assessment of damages.
- B. The State may be open to negotiations of Performance Standards prior to contract award, prior to the commencement of services, or at times throughout the contract duration.
- C. The State **shall** have the right to modify, add, or delete Performance Standards throughout the term of the contract, should the State determine it is in its best interest to do so. Any changes or additions to performance standards will be made in good faith following acceptable industry standards, and may include the input of the vendor so as to establish standards that are reasonably achievable.
- D. All changes made to the Performance Standards **shall** become an official part of the contract.
- E. Performance Standards **shall** continue throughout the term of the contract.
- F. Failure to meet the minimum Performance Standards as specified **may** result in the assessment of damages or termination of the contract.
- G. In the event a Performance Standard is not met, the vendor will have the opportunity to defend, respond to, or cure to as determined by the State, the insufficiency. The State **may** waive damages if it determines there were extenuating factors beyond the control of the vendor that hindered the performance of services or it is in the best interest of the State. In these instances, the State **shall** have final determination of the performance acceptability.

Should any compensation be owed to the agency due to the assessment of damages, vendor **shall** follow the direction of the agency regarding the required compensation process.

SECTION 3 – GENERAL CONTRACTUAL REQUIREMENTS

3.1 PAYMENT AND INVOICE PROVISIONS

- A. All invoices shall be forwarded to: see attachment E for invoicing instructions.
- B. Payment will be made in accordance with applicable State of Arkansas accounting procedures upon acceptance goods and services by the agency.
- C. The State **shall not** be invoiced in advance of delivery and acceptance of any goods or services.
- D. Payment will be made only after the vendor has successfully satisfied the agency as to the reliability and effectiveness of the goods or services purchased as a whole.
- E. The vendor should invoice the agency by an itemized list of charges. The agency's Purchase Order Number and/or the Contract Number should be referenced on each invoice.
- F. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements for invoicing.
- G. Selected vendor **must** be registered to receive payment and future *Bid Solicitation* notifications. Vendors may register on-line at <https://www.ark.org/vendor/index.html>.

3.2 GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. The State **shall not** lease any equipment or software for a period of time which continues past the end of a fiscal year unless the contract allows for cancellation by the State Procurement Official upon a 30 day written notice to the vendor/lessor in the event funds are not appropriated.
- B. The State **shall not** contract with another party to indemnify and defend that party for any liability and damages.
- C. The State **shall not** pay damages, legal expenses or other costs and expenses of any other party.
- D. The State **shall not** continue a contract once any equipment has been repossessed.
- E. Any litigation involving the State **must** take place in Pulaski County, Arkansas.
- F. The State **shall not** agree to any provision of a contract which violates the laws or constitution of the State of Arkansas.
- G. The State **shall not** enter a contract which grants to another party any remedies other than the following:
 - The right to possession.
 - The right to accrued payments.
 - The right to expenses of deinstallation.
 - The right to expenses of repair to return the equipment to normal working order, normal wear and tear excluded.
 - The right to recover only amounts due at the time of repossession and any unamortized nonrecurring cost as allowed by Arkansas Law.
- H. The laws of the State of Arkansas **shall** govern this contract.
- I. A contract **shall not** be effective prior to award being made by a State Procurement Official.
- J. In a contract with another party, the State will accept the risk of loss of the equipment or software and pay for any destruction, loss or damage of the equipment or software while the State has such risk, when:

- The extent of liability for such risk is based upon the purchase price of the equipment or software at the time of any loss, and
- The contract has required the State to carry insurance for such risk.

3.3 CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

- A. The vendor **shall** at all times observe and comply with federal and State of Arkansas laws, local laws, ordinances, orders, and regulations existing at the time of, or enacted subsequent to the execution of a resulting contract which in any manner affect the completion of the work.
- B. The vendor **shall** indemnify and save harmless the agency and all its officers, representatives, agents, and employees against any claim or liability arising from or based upon the violation of any such law, ordinance, regulation, order or decree by an employee, representative, or subcontractor of the vendor.
- C. The vendor agrees to DHS Standard Terms and Conditions as presented in Attachment A, a pro forma contract as presented in Attachment C, the Performance Based Contracting standards as presented in Attachment D, and the Business Associate Agreement as presented in Attachment B.

3.4 STATEMENT OF LIABILITY

- A. The State will demonstrate reasonable care but will not be liable in the event of loss, destruction or theft of vendor-owned equipment or software and technical and business or operations literature to be delivered or to be used in the installation of deliverables and services. The vendor **shall** retain total liability for equipment, software and technical and business or operations literature. The State **shall** not at any time be responsible for or accept liability for any vendor-owned items.
- B. The vendor's liability for damages to the State **shall** be limited to the value of the Contract or \$5,000,000, whichever is higher. The foregoing limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademarks or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract. The vendor and the State **shall not** be liable to each other, regardless of the form of action, for consequential, incidental, indirect, or special damages. This limitation of liability **shall not** apply to claims for infringement of United States patent, copyright, trademark or trade secrets; to claims for personal injury or damage to property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the vendor; to claims covered by other specific provisions of the Contract calling for damages; or to court costs or attorney's fees awarded by a court in addition to damages after litigation based on the Contract.
- C. Language in these terms and conditions **shall not** be construed or deemed as the State's waiver of its right of sovereign immunity. The vendor agrees that any claims against the State, whether sounding in tort or in contract, **shall** be brought before the Arkansas State Claims Commission as provided by Arkansas law, and **shall** be governed accordingly.

3.5 RECORD RETENTION

- A. The vendor **shall** maintain all pertinent financial and accounting records and evidence pertaining to the contract in accordance with generally accepted principles of accounting and as specified by the State of Arkansas Law. Upon request, access **shall** be granted to State or Federal Government entities or any of their duly authorized representatives.
- B. Financial and accounting records **shall** be made available, upon request, to the State of Arkansas's designee(s) at any time during the contract period and any extension thereof, and for five (5) years from expiration date and final payment on the contract or extension thereof.
- C. Other sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional Requirements regarding record retention.

3.6 PRICE ESCALATION

- A. Price increases will be considered at the time of contract renewal.

- B. The vendor **must** provide to OP a written request for the price increase. The request **must** include supporting documentation demonstrating that the increase in contract price is based on an increase in market price. OP **shall** have the right to require additional information pertaining to the requested increase.
- C. Increases **shall not** be considered to increase profit or margins.
- D. OP **shall** have the right to approve or deny the request.

3.7 **CONFIDENTIALITY**

- A. The vendor, vendor's subsidiaries, and vendor's employees **shall** be bound to all laws and to all Requirements set forth in this *Bid Solicitation* concerning the confidentiality and secure handling of information of which they may become aware of during the course of providing services under a resulting contract.
- B. Consistent and/or uncorrected breaches of confidentiality may constitute grounds for cancellation of a resulting contract, and the State **shall** have the right to cancel the contract on these grounds.
- C. Previous sections of this *Bid Solicitation* may contain additional confidentiality Requirements.
- D. OP shall have the right to approve or deny the request.

3.8 **CONTRACT INTERPRETATION**

Should the State and vendor interpret specifications differently, either party may request clarification. However if an agreement cannot be reached, the determination of the State **shall** be final and controlling.

3.9 **CANCELLATION**

- A. In the event the State no longer needs the service or commodity specified in the contract or purchase order due to program changes, changes in laws, rules, or regulations, relocation of offices, or lack of appropriated funding, the State **shall** give the vendor written notice of cancellation, specifying the terms and the effective date of contract termination. The effective date of termination **shall** be 30 days from the date of notification, unless a longer timeframe is specified in the notification.
- B. Upon default of a vendor, the State **shall** agree to pay only sums due for goods and services received and accepted up to cancellation of the contract.
- C. In addition to other remedies, including without limitation damages, provided for under the contract, failure of a vendor to satisfy any Performance Standard is grounds for the State to terminate the contract. Before the State exercises its right to terminate the contract for failure of a vendor to satisfy a Performance Standard, the vendor may be given an opportunity to defend, respond to, or cure as determined by the State, the identified insufficiency in Performance Standards if it is determined to be in the best interest of the State. The effective date of termination shall be 30 days from the date of notification, unless a longer timeframe is specified in the notification.

3.10 **SEVERABILITY**

If any provision of the contract, including items incorporated by reference, is declared or found to be illegal, unenforceable, or void, then both the agency and the vendor **shall** be relieved of all obligations arising under such provision. If the remainder of the contract is capable of performance, it **shall not** be affected by such declaration or finding and **shall** be fully performed.
