Subject: TDMA Network

We are committed to providing our customers with the highest quality wireless service. AT&T Mobility has invested over \$6.6 billion dollars in our network last year and have over 40,000 cell sites throughout the country. The superior service, advanced features and next generation devices you expect are available only on the AT&T Mobility GSM ALLOVER network. AT&T Mobility's GSM network is the largest digital voice and data network in America, covering 273 million people and growing, and utilizes the preferred worldwide standard in wireless networking technology.

As you may be aware AT&T Mobility's TDMA/analog network will be completely shut down in February 2008. Many TDMA cell sites or overlays are in the process of being phased out during the remainder of 2007, directly impacting TDMA service in the effected markets.

The TDMA wireless network is an older network with limited capabilities. AT&T Mobility can no longer provide services and features that our Government customers require on this older platform. In addition, most manufacturers no longer produce TDMA/analog phones. Currently, over 99 percent of all minutes used are carried on our GSM network. As a result, AT&T Mobility is encouraging all of our TDMA customers to migrate to our higher-quality GSM network.

We strongly believe the quality of our service delivery far exceeds any inconvenience this may cause. Our commitment is to provide your customers with the best service experience in the industry. Please coordinate directly with your Government Account Manager to migrate your end users before October 1, 2007, to ensure that your service will not be disrupted.
